Life Group Discussion Questions:

Looking back on this past year, would you say you are known for what you are AGAINST or what you are FOR? Why is it so easy to be known for what we are against? What are some major issues you are against.

Read John 13:33-35

In verse 33 what is about to happen? Why is Jesus referring to them as children? How does this set the stage for the next verse?

In verse 34 we are told this is a new commandment. Is this the first time we are told to love our neighbour? (see Lev. 19:18). Why did the author tell us it was a new commandment?

What is Jesus saying in verse 35. What should we take away from this verse? Is this a convicting statement? Does it reassure you? Is it confusing? Explain.

List some practical ways you can show love to those around you.

What step do you need to take this week to becoming someone that is known for their love and being FOR others. What issues or struggles do you need to lay aside for the sake of love. Pray for one another in these specific applications.
