- 4. Read 1 Timothy 6:18. How does this verse help us to define what being rich is really about? Does this challenge your goals or practices when it comes to family, career and finances? Compare this verse with what our culture tells us about what it is to be rich. Which do you think is more satisfying? Why do you think it is so hard for many of us to pursue this kind of generosity?
