Discussion Questions

3. What do you think should be the mindset of Christians when it comes to work? Why should we work? With what attitude should we work? With what purpose(s) should we work? What do you think the goal of working should be?
4. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:9-12. How do these verses help you think about how you should approach your vocation? How do verses 9-10 connect with verses 11-12? How does this change the way you think about the purpose of working? Does it change the way you think about what you should do and how you should do it?
5. How does our culture teach us to figure out what kind of job we'll pursue? Do these verses move us in a different direction? How does that help you think about the kind of vocation you should pursue?
6. Do you ever face ethical dilemmas in your work? What would you tell someone to do if they are put in a position to participate in or do something that violates their beliefs or conscience? Do you have any personal examples?
